Sanhedrin condemned him as blasphemer and accused him as a revolutionary
 before the Roman Procurator (Jn 19,1-9)596
 Not all Jews were responsible (Ac 3,17-19)597
 All are responsible for his death (1 Pet 2,24-25)598
 His death was part of the Divine Plan (Ac 2,23)599
 Scriptures foretold it (Is 53,7-8).....601
 He suffered for all (1 Jn 2,2).....605
 His sacrifice replaced all others (Heb 10,10).....614
 We remember and offer it in the Mass (1 Co 11,23-32).....610

He was buried (Jn 19,38-42)624
