The Leadership Workshop in Loretto, PA, was absolutely wonderful. Five from my fraternity attended, including our spiritual director. Now we must decide to use the gifts we've been given so we can answer the call we have received."

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Peace and everything good to you. I hope you are all having a delightful summer. I've been enjoying some wonderful vacation time these days. I remember a rather insistent gentleman years ago who said that because I am a priest I don't get a vacation. Maybe he was kidding, but he seemed quite serious. I thought he might do well to get in touch with reality, and that priests, like everyone else, are human.

So do you think St. Francis ever took a vacation? To respond to such a question we might consider the derivation of the word *vacation*. It comes from the Latin word *vacuo*, to make empty, but also *vacatio*, a noun meaning freedom, immunity, exemption. So I'm left with the question of whether we use the time of vacation to really empty

ourselves of our busy, frenetic activities, or if we fill the time with scurrying about from one dizzying activity after another. We seem to be bent on constant stimulation, and I wonder if we have lost the ability to slow down, even to stop for a time.

During some of the vacation time I've just experienced, the time was punctuated by the jingling of cell phones, interrupting our already on-going activities with reminders of the responsibilities that we thought we had left behind, and calling us to account, such that we could not escape to any real "freedom, immunity, exemption" from the stress of life ... unless, perhaps we might hit the "off" button on the phone, or perhaps do the unthinkable thing, and that is to leave the little device at home!

"Francis, Build Up My Church ..."

With anticipation of August 2 and the special feast of **Our Lady of the Angels of the Portiuncula**, what wonderful thoughts fill my mind as I consider this day and St. Francis! And how wonderful that this year the feast falls on the very day we will be celebrating together at Mayslake Village!

We know how greatly St. Francis loved our Holy Mother Mary, so much so that in Chapter 2.9 of our Holy Rule we read "she was embraced by Francis with an indescribable love and declared the protectress and advocate of his family."

Anyone reading the life of St. Francis also identifies the great devotion Francis had to the Holy Angels. We know that Francis begged for stones to rebuild three houses of God, the second of these was named for "Our Lady of the Angels".

Every year St. Francis began his "Lent of St.

Michael" on the Feast of the Assumption. Anyone pondering Francis and the Holy Gospels knows Francis didn't want to imitate the Gospel so much as to *be* Gospel. So then, with that in mind and on the occasion of this special feast, let us consider a few occasions of Mary and the Holy Angels in the life of Christ and St. Francis.

We know that at the Annunciation, the Angel Gabriel was sent from God the Father to announce to Mary that He had found great favor with her and that she was to become the mother of God by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit. (The angel brought the message of God's grace and by grace Mary responds to this call with her fiat, "Let it be done to me according to your word." Luke 1:38). Let us consider how we might imagine Francis overflowing with God's

love pronouncing his "fiat", that whatever God wanted of him he would he would do with the help of Mary and the holy angels.

Again, we hear the holy angels announcing the birth of Jesus. They guided holy souls searching for Jesus to His crib, singing, "Glory to God in the Highest and peace on earth to men of good will!" Reflect on Francis' wish for peace to all, and in humility giving glory to God, praising Him for His works and the gifts of all creation.

And while our Lord was in the Garden of Gethsemane, it was the angel who gave strength to Jesus as He suffered agony before His crucifixion. (Recall here the sixwinged Seraph when St. Francis received the stigmata.) We also see the holy angels at the Resurrection and the Ascension of our Lord.

To honor of this feast, I would like to borrow excerpts from the Office of Readings (from Thomas of Celano; Analecta Franciscana 10, 142.182) for August 2:

Consider God's dwelling worthy of all honor

"The servant of God, Francis, an unassuming humble person, a man of no importance in his own opinion, while dwelling on earth chose for himself and his followers a small place. Without this small place he would not have been able to render service to Christ in this world. It was not, however, without some knowledge of the Scriptures that the place long ago was named Small Portion (Portiuncula), a place destined for those who desired to own nothing whatever of this world. A church had been erected here to the honor of the Virgin Mother who because of her marvelous humility ... merited to be the first of all saints.

"... Although Francis realized that the kingdom of heaven is found in every dwelling on earth, and though he believed that heaven's graces are imparted everywhere to God's chosen ones, he had learned nevertheless that the church of Saint Mary at Portiuncula was filled with

more abundant grace and visited more frequently by heavenly spirits. Consequently he used to say to his friars: 'See to it, my sons, that you never leave this place. If you are driven out by one door return by the other for this is truly a holy place and God's dwelling. Here when we were few, the Most High increased our number; here he enlightened the hearts of his poor with the light of his own wisdom; here he inflamed our wills with the fire of his love. He who prays here with devout heart will obtain his request, and he who offends here will be punished more severely. Therefore, my sons, consider the place of God's dwelling worthy of all honor and with all your hearts, with loud cries of joy and thanksgiving praise the Lord in this place."

It is a fact that Francis frequently came to this holy chapel, that no place was dearer to him. It was here he spent many years and it was from here that "he winged his flight to heaven". Here with the Blessed Virgin's encouragement, he became the founder of three Orders, received his first disciples, and consecrated Saint Clare to God's service.

In the loving shelter of this chapel, Francis gathered his band of friars and sent them forth as soldiers of Christ to wage holy wars. (Hymn from Office of Readings).

"Fountain of mercy, mother of grace, hope of the world, hear us as we call to you, because all virtue and beauty and glory are resplendent in you." Mary, Queen of all angels pray for us! Teach us to love the holy angels of God.

Living the Gospel of Life

Amazingly, our General Minister of the OFM branch of the Franciscan Order has encouraged us to take a "moratorium," or a suspension of activity, from time to time. In a report on our Extraordinary General Chapter of 2006, he wrote: "We Friars are often victims of the illusion of the productivity of our lives — ministries, commitments. The need for an experience of a hermitage, of solitude or of a moratorium seems to be a luxury for some original or 'rare' Friars, something that would represent only the loss of precious time to the 'normal' or 'committed' Friars."

And if it is difficult for us friars, then I am sure it is even more difficult for you who are lay people, who have the responsibilities of family, job, ministry, and more.

This month of August brings several feasts which might call us to consider how we could take some "vacation" or "moratorium," time even for just part of a
