## Minister's Message

Dear brothers and sisters,

At this time of year when our fraternities are asking us to contribute a little more to help pay the "fair share" of the expenses of the Order, I think it is appropriate to briefly review what this contribution is about AND what it provides each of us in the Order. The basis for it comes from Article 25 of the Rule:

Regarding expenses necessary for the life of the fraternity and the needs of worship, of the apostolate, and of charity, all the brothers and sisters should offer a contribution according to their means. Local fraternities should contribute toward the expenses of the higher fraternity councils.

Please note that the local fraternities, not individuals, contribute toward the expenses of the higher fraternity councils (that is, the regional, national, and international fraternities). While we each are reminded to help our fraternities meet this obligation, it isn't a matter of each person paying "dues" of \$25 apiece. Rather, it's approximately what the expenses for the higher levels of fraternity work out to per person – all are to contribute "according to their means" in order to make up the amount needed on a fraternity by fraternity basis.

The "fair share", then, is the means for supporting the higher levels of fraternity. What do you get for that? Here are a few examples. At the regional level, of course, we have events such as the gathering for the feast of the Portiuncula, the Mother Cabrini celebration (refreshments are partially underwritten by the Region), the Leadership Workshop and so forth. The *SFO News*, the regional website, and vocation and apostolic activities are also supported by each fraternity's contributions.

The most visible sign of how our money is spent nationally is the *TAU-USA*. What a blessing for us to have this fine publication!

All professed members should be receiving TAU-USA quarterly (fraternity ministers, please contact me with names and addresses of any professed members who are *not* receiving TAU-USA). Those who are not professed can visit the NAFRA website (*www.nafra-sfo.org*) to read the newsletter in its entirety or article by article.

On the international level, formation has been identified as the #1 priority for the Order. CIOFS, the International Presidency, has developed initial formation materials for use worldwide, which are being adapted for our needs by the National Formation Commission. You will also be seeing some communications about the new materials for ongoing formation from International.

These are some of the concrete benefits you derive from your "fair share" contributions. The fact is that at each level of fraternity, we have Secular Franciscans coming together to deal with the challenges we face, to set goals for the future, and in general to "animate and guide" our Order. Each of our fraternities is helping to fund that vital work for the future of the Order. Please contribute as you are able to help your fraternity make up its fair share.

This is an appropriate place to mention that The National Fraternity voted to donate \$1000 from its donor fund to help the people of Haiti through Catholic Relief Services. Our Region will be adding \$200 to that sum. Please remember the people of Haiti, both now and in the months and years to come, as they work to rebuild their country.

May the Lord's peace be with you and all those dear to you.

## Spiritual Assistant's Message

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Here we are, deep into Winter once again where we are somewhat restricted by the cold climate and the limited sunlight. All of this is familiar to us in our region of the country. These conditions can be frustrating and potentially depressing arising from situations such as cabin fever, bruises from falling, or the reality of isolation. However, instead of focusing on the negatives, let's look at where we are from a different perspective; one that is more optimistic and hopeful.

It seems to me that Winter offers us a perfect opportunity to embrace a spirit of prayer and contemplation. Consider how inviting it is to gaze into a bright warm fireplace, or how comforting it is to prepare a hearty soup, or how delightful it is to wrap yourself in a blanket as you enjoy the sight of snow falling like God's love on everything. All of these occasions, and so many others, offer us golden opportunities to ponder and consider our lives, our Franciscan vocations, our relationship to God, our history.

Now, consider this. I find it interesting as I ponder the current entries in the Proper Offices of Franciscan Saints and Blesseds in the Liturgy of the Hours (which is published by the English-speaking conference of the Order of Friars Minor) that there are two memorials in place to honor Franciscan martyrs.

The first on January 16th is in honor of Berard, the priest and companions who were the first disciples of Saint Francis to be martyred. In 1220 they were chained, cruelly tortured and finally condemned in Marrakech, Morocco. These excellent friars and their companions came to be known as the Protomartyrs. I encourage you to explore and share this story with your community.

Then on February 6th we honor Peter Baptist, Paul Miki and their companions, who incidentally were lay Franciscans. These courageous people achieved the crown of martyrdom on February 5, 1597 in Nagasaki. This important Franciscan story which takes place in Feudal Japan is filled with tension, danger and intrigue as well as history. This sorrowful and brutal episode demonstrates how cultural clashes have resulted in tragedy. Explore their story and share what surfaces with your fraternity and faith community.

I pray that during these Winter months you all may grow deeper in faith, understanding and knowledge as you read and share stories of Franciscan development throughout evangelical history.
