# Minister's Message

Dear brothers and sisters,

I hope your summer is going well, despite the current heat wave as I write this. I hope you have found some time to slow down and recharge - or that you will before the summer is over.

As professed Secular Franciscans, we have promised to follow the SFO Rule. It's easy to forget that the Rule itself commits us to far more than just the Rule itself! I tend to go quickly over Article 3 of the Rule, but let's look at it now (italics mine):

Rule 3. The present rule, succeeding "Memoriale Propositi" (1221) and the Rules approved by the Supreme Pontiffs Nicholas IV and Leo XIII, adapts the Secular Franciscan Order to the needs and expectations of the Holy Church in the conditions of changing times. Its interpretation belongs to the Holy See and *its application will be made by the General Constitutions and particular statutes.* 

This means that by professing our Rule, we have also committed ourselves to the General Constitutions and the National and International Statutes, because <u>they tell us</u> <u>how to apply the Rule</u>. This is made clearer by Article 4 of the General Constitutions themselves:

**4.1.** The SFO is governed by the universal law of the Church, and by its own: the Rule, the Constitutions, the Ritual, and the particular statutes. [*Note that the Ritual is part of our governing documents as well.*]

**4.2.** The Rule establishes the nature, purpose, and spirit of the SFO.

**4.3.** *Rule 3* The Constitutions have as their purpose:

- ✤ to apply the Rule;
- to indicate concretely the conditions for belonging to the SFO, its government, the organization of life in fraternity, and its seat.

It should be clear by now that if we don't know our Constitutions, we don't know how to live our life as Secular Franciscans. I echo the words of Blessed John Paul II to the Tenth General Chapter of the SFO in 2003, "study, love and live your General Constitutions!" The General Constitutions and National Statutes are readily available at the NAFRA website, http://www.nafra-sfo.org. The General Constitutions document includes links to Portuguese, Polish, Korean, and Vietnamese translations; the Statutes are also available in Korean. The Rule, Constitutions, International Statutes, International version of the Ritual, and Statutes for Spiritual Assistance are available in the four official languages of the SFO (Italian, French, Spanish, and English) at http://www\_ciofs.org/a9enodoc.htm.

Electronic copies of these documents allows the reader to search for a reference to a particular article of the Rule in the Constitutions (such as the reference to Rule 3 above), making it easy to cross-reference the Rule and the Constitutions (and the Statutes as well). However, a printed copy can be easier to read. A good resource is the Essential Documents of the Secular Franciscan Order, available with the order form on the last page of TAU-USA. If you are professed and not receiving TAU-USA, let you minister know. TAU-USA is available electronically at the NAFRA website mentioned above. I encourage you to take a good look at the entire list of NAFRA publications listed on that page, including Fr. Lester Bach's latest formation book, The Franciscan Journey. Many of the books have significant bulk discounts; consider making a fraternity order!

May your study of the Constitutions help you follow Christ more closely in the spirit of Francis and Clare.

# Spiritual Assistant's Message

# An Exciting New Era for Initial Formation

Initial Formation will be taking on a whole new approach as we begin to implement the Universal Standardized Formation Program as directed by the General Presidency of the Secular Franciscan Order.

Following the extensive work and research done by the International Formation Commission and the great work done by our National Formation Commission, we are ready to embark on this exciting new, integrated approach to initial formation for our Inquirers and Candidates across the whole world! The 405,000 Professed Secular Franciscans world wide have welcomed this exciting, creative and much anticipated program of formation, which will fully explain and teach our Secular Franciscan charism in a thorough, balanced and faithful manner.

All of the Regional Ministers and Formation Directors across the USA gathered at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows in Belleville, IL this past May for the unveiling of the new *For Up to Now (FUN)* Manual, which is a comprehensive resource for formation directors in every Fraternity in the USA. It is not a textbook for those in Formation, but rather a thorough reference manual for those whose ministry is formation. This rich and complete work will be made available to all the formation directors, ministers and spiritual assistants of our Mother Cabrini Region at our September workshop for Ministers, Formation Directors, Formation team members and spiritual assistants.

At that time, the members of the Regional Formation Commission will demonstrate the use of a model curriculum which can be followed by local fraternities, or they are free to develop their own, so long as all of the areas required by the Minister General and the General Presidency of our Order are covered during the time of Initial Formation.

Please pray for us as we prepare to launch this exciting new venture in the Initial Formation Process. With the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we will be able to teach and share our unique Secular Franciscan Charism with generations to come.

In late breaking news, we were informed that the FUN Manual has been translated into Spanish and will be made available to us soon. It is expected that it will also be translated into Korean and perhaps other languages as well.

Let us offer a prayer of thanks for the Formation Commissions (International and National) for their hard work and dedication that have brought us this incredible resource and new approach to Initial Formation.

- One-on-one relational meetings are a basic tool of citizens' organizations. Citizens' organizations are formed specifically to organize citizenry, usually through religious and other non-profit organizations, to help the membership help themselves. - Ken Beattie, SFO is the immediate past Regional Minister of LaVerna Region (most of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan). Ken has been involved with FAN since the first meeting in Baltimore in 2007.

• The Spirituality of Power and Power Analysis and Upcoming Opportunities – power has to do with our ability to organize so we can accomplish something; it has nothing to do with overcoming others.

That should give you some idea of what is happening in Milwaukee on July 26 and 27. I look forward to reporting what happens.

Meanwhile I received some materials from Kent Ferris, SFO, our JPIC National Councilor, with respect to Fair Trade products offered by Catholic Relief Services (CRS). There are actually a number of Fair Trade companies who offer their products through CRS. This was all new to me; my parish sells Fair Trade products but we order them from Equal Exchange. The most common products are coffee, tea, and chocolate. Some companies sell various crafts as well. What's so great about Fair Trade products is the "middle man" is bypassed; and in so doing, the farmers and craftsmen who produce these products have a chance of making a living. With coffee, for example, growers who work with the large coffee corporations only make about 25 cents per pound of coffee beans. (Remember, coffee beans must be picked by hand.) However, those who work for Fair Trade companies make about \$1.25 per pound - a huge difference - which allows the farmers to provide for their families (very simply) and to allow their children to go to school.

In going over the information Kent sent me, one needs to choose the company they would like to work with, and then make contact. I will try to better organize this information and have it available at the August Gathering for those who are interested. It's a wonderful way to help the poor help themselves.
